EARTH TALK

What's the most effective way to remove pesticide residues from fruits and vegetables that I buy at the supermarket?

For many decades now, pesticides have been a vital tool for farmers to ensure that their harvests aren't overgrown by weeds or eaten by pests. As a result, pesticides remain prevalent today, in spite of the many health risks that pesticide residues still pose to people consuming fruits and vegetables. It's worth noting that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has placed some limits on the amount of pesticide residue found on produce, called "tolerances" to ensure that people will most likely not be impacted by harmful "persistent organic pollutants" (POPs) such as glyphosate and atrazine. However, it's still important to make individual efforts to clean produce to further protect your personal health and safety.

A recent report from the American Chemical Society analyzed data provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and found that 20 percent of 59 different produce categories posed significant health risks to consumers despite current pesticide limits. The researchers developed new methods for finding and removing traces of pesticides from produce, as they found that traditional methods of cleaning pro-

duce were insufficient. Most notably, the report posits that pesticides go beyond the produce's surface to leach into the food, meaning that washing may not be as effective. Especially with soft skins such as peaches, strawberries etc. Further research is needed to determine the full risks and implications of current pesticide limits.

There are varied opinions on the best methods for removing pesticide residues from produce. Rinsing produce is somewhat helpful for cleaning off dirt and germs, but soaking their fruits and vegetables in warm vinegar or salt solutions may be better; however, some sources claim that exposure to these solutions may allow chemicals to form more complex, equally dangerous chemical compounds, so always follow soaking with thorough rinsing. Finally, peeling or boiling produce can be highly effective in removing residues, but you will suffer a loss of nutrients.

The only way to significantly reduce your exposure to synthetic chemicals is by buying organic, as organics are not grown with the assistance of hazardous pesticides. You may have to pay a little more, but isn't your health and peace of mind worth it? The Environmental Working Group (EWG) has valuable info on their website and a list of what produce contains the most harmful chemicals. It is a good guide to know what items are more important to buy organically grown.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Turkey Bacon & Spinach Quiche with Sweet Potato Crust



Preheat oven to 400 F. Lightly spray 9-inch pie pan with nonstick cooking spray.

In medium bowl, using box grater, grate sweet potato. Measure out 2 cups. Gently press sweet potato on bottom and up sides of pan, forming crust. Sweet potato will be loose but will hold together once cooked.

Bake 20 minutes, or until crust is cooked. Remove from oven. Let stand to cool. Reduce oven temperature to 350 F.

In medium skillet, heat oil over medium heat, swirling to coat bottom. Cook onion 4 minutes, or until almost translucent, stirring frequently. Add turkey bacon. Cook 3-4 minutes, or until onion and bacon begin to brown, stirring frequently. Add spinach, dillweed, salt and pepper. Cook 1-2 minutes, or until water from spinach is released. Remove from heat. Transfer mixture into sweet potato crust.

In medium bowl, whisk egg whites, eggs and milk. Pour over mixture in crust. Sprinkle feta over top.

Bake 35-40 minutes, or until knife inserted into center comes out clean. Transfer to cooling rack. Let cool 10 minutes before cutting into wedges.

- 1 tsp olive oil
- 1 medium yellow onion, diced
- 6 slices uncured, nitrate-free turkey bacon, thinly sliced
- 10 oz frozen chopped spinach, thawed
- 3/4 tsp dried dillweed, crumbled
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp freshly ground pepper
- 4 large egg whites
- 2 large eggs
- 1/4 cup fat-free milk
- 1 1/2 tbs fat-free feta cheese


